Church Family,

As many of you know, I enjoy poetry. I particularly enjoy Coleridge’s
poem, The Rime of the Ancient Mariner. I enjoy Henry Wadsworth Longfellow as
well. However, one of my special poems that I really enjoy was set to music
many years ago. It was written by Charles Wesley in a song called, “Arise, My
Soul, Arise!”

The third verse of the song goes like this:

“Five bleeding wounds he bears, received on Calvary;
they pour effectual prayers, they strongly plead for me. "Forgive him, O forgive,"
they cry, "forgive him, O forgive," they cry, "nor let that ransomed sinner die, nor
let that ransomed sinner die!"

It is not merely important, but vital that we understand that Jesus’
wounds were in our place. From His stripes from the scourging, the nails in His
feet, the nails in His hands, the crown of thrones, and the piercing of His side all
working together for the good of God’s perfect will. Sinners, you, and me, are
ransomed because of this. Blood had to be shed for sins to be forgiven.
“Without shedding of blood there is no remission” (Hebrews 9:22b). These
wounds should have been our wounds, but Jesus took our place. His blood was
shed, so that sin would be forgiven. His substitutionary act was to reveal that
God loves sinners. In this act, we see that God will not tolerate sin.

Sin has a price and we are coming into a time of the year when we are
not only reminded often throughout the year, but now much more often as we
think about what happened at the cross. Jesus’ wounds bled every drop of His
blood. His wounds would declare that all of the sheep that had gone astray
would now be ransomed from the punishment of their sins. Glory to God! Jesus
died for us. He died a sinner’s death. He gave His life that we may live.
